Dear Concordia Family,

I've been reading a book of a collection of papers written by Rev. David P. Scaer, pastor and still professor at Concordia Theological Seminary in Fort Wayne. He also has a book of memoirs of some of the stormy times of the LCMS which I'm also looking forward to reading. Pastor Scaer was an active voice for the truth of the Word and Gospel during the tumultuous "Walkout". The papers he wrote on the issues during those times (and after), apart from references to certain people of the times, could have been written yesterday. The issues plaguing the Christian Church and pure doctrine have not, and do not change over the years. The antagonists and platforms look different, and the

names change, but always at the core of the issues is the spirit of the antichrist, and the spirit of unbelief; "Did God really say...?"

Pastor Scaer answered that question with a resounding "yes!" and then proceeded to write and teach the Lutheran Church exactly what God has said, along with answering "What does this mean?" With objective and biblical evaluation of the issues, Pastor Scaer took on the discussions and contentions of that time.

My son, be attentive to my wisdom; incline your ear to my understanding, that you may keep discretion, and your lips may guard knowledge. - Proverbs 5:1

I am continually humbled to learn from reading books by such great men. I wish I could have sat at their feet to learn and ask questions. I'm grateful many men have, and still do, at our Seminaries.

Aside from books, the opportunities for most Lutherans to access such a rich treasure of deep theology is limited in day-to-day life. Sunday mornings, Wednesdays in Lent, and Bible Studies do present opportunities to learn and grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and His Word.

We also have examples of many great and faithful men (and wone) in our own church. The "elders" among us are a trove of real-world learned knowledge and applied theology which they have accumulated over the years.

Gray hair is a crown of glory; it is gained in a righteous life.
- Proverbs 16:31

Listen to advice and accept instruction, that you may gain wisdom in the future.

- Proverbs 19:20

Dear "elders" of Concordia please share your wisdom and experiences with the younger generations, especially in the household of faith. Tell how you struggled with sin, and even with faith at times. Share your favorite Bible stories and verses and explain why. Give an example, make an impression on the people of our congregation younger than you, as you are able, that we may learn from you the importance of Christ and His Church in our daily life.

In turn "young people" (and that could be young in age, young in faith, or merely younger than the "elders" of our congregation), listen to the wisdom of the elders and mature in the faith. Observe them, ask them, learn and glean from them as you would honor your own parents. Learn and grow in the household of faith! "Do not rebuke an older man but encourage him as you would a father, younger men as brothers, older women as mothers, younger women as sisters, in all purity." (1 Timothy 5:1-2)

Our Theme for our Lent Midweek Servies this year is "Reflections on Repentance." We will focus on Psalm 51—King David's Psalm of repentance after his sin of adultery with Bathsheba is uncovered. David learned many lessons in those days which he wishes he didn't have to learn, but now we benefit from him sharing his experience. Our Lenten Daily Devotions "Jesus Christ, My Lord," written by many excellent pastors, will reflect on "...the confession of who we are by nature—fallen creatures needing a Lord," as we learn in the 2nd article of the Apostles' Creed. A life of repentance is shown in action, generosity, wisdom, and faith. God grant we live and learn from our "elders", both in person and from books, for the good of our own families, our family of faith at Concordia, and even the whole Church for generations to come before the return of Christ.

Pew Ponderings

From the Pew: "Confession is a twice daily part of my prayers. Some days I begin by saying, "Father, look not upon my sin this day. Instead, may you see Jesus". I also pray that God would see the blood of His Son, my Savior, covering over all my sins and see also the white robe of righteousness He has placed on me.

I recently read a quote from Martin Luther where he said, "we have nothing and we need everything".

I have also heard that Luther once said that we sinners are all beggars before God. We have no ability to fulfill the Law perfectly like God commands or to save ourselves from our sins. As the hymn Rock of Ages declares, "Nothing in my hand I bring, Simply to Thy cross I cling". We are completely dependent upon God for the "everything" we need. Ponder this - our God loves us so much He sent His only Son to the cross to suffer and die so that we could have "everything" including the forgiveness of sin!

From the Pastor: Subjective and Objective Justification is vital to understand correctly-and it's actually quite simple! We remember that justification is the doctrine upon which the church stands or falls; one is either justified before God by the blood of Christ (thanks be to God!), or one must justify themselves before God (fat chance). When any human effort is added to justification, sinners become responsible to make a case why they should be allowed into eternal life, and the church falls. The Scriptural doctrine of **Objective (or Universal) Justification** is simply this: Christ is the Savior of all people and He bore and atoned for all sins, and righteousness has been procured for all people unilaterally without any dependance on man's response to it. The message of the Gospel, therefore, is that all your sins are forgiven (not may be or will be forgiven!) because of what Christ has done (see 2 Corinthians 5:18-19). God sees the whole world with "cross-eyes"-the cross of Jesus! **Subjective (or Individual) Justification**, then is God forgiving YOU and declaring YOU righteous for the sake of Christ (See Romans 4:5-8). Justification is thus by faith, not by works. God justifies a person when he or she hears the Gospel and the Holy Spirit creates faith in the Gospel in that person. The Gospel is not the Good News with an "if", as in "God forgives you all your sins if you..." No, it's a declaration (like you can hear every Sunday!), "God forgives you your sins." No ifs! Everything we need is a gift of God, including justification and faith! Confessing your sins is a sanctified exercise, seeing where sin has encroached in your life, and turning away and to Christ for forgiveness and life. God has not withheld the the blood of His Son from you, but covers all your sins and iniquities. This is a gift! You are justified by grace, for Christ's sake, through faith, apart from works of the Law! (NOTE: Some assistance with clear verbiage from a Bible Study by the CTCR on objective and subjective justification)



The Geneseo-Atkinson Food Pantry is open: Mondays 9:00-7:00, Tuesdays and Thursdays 9:00-4:00, and Fridays 9:00-12:00. Food is distributed, and donations are gratefully accepted during business hours. We also have collection boxes in the vestibule at Fareway, NOSH, and Inspire Continuing Care for donations. The Clothing room is closed on Fridays. The Food Pantry will be **closed on April 18** in observance of Good Friday.

Because of the community's generous support, the Food Pantry provided food assistance to **356** households in January. Thanks to the many donors who make this possible! The Food Pantry rescues food from Aldi, Dollar Fresh, Dollar General, Fareway, Jewel, McDonald's, NOSH, Pizza Hut, and Walmart (Geneseo and Silvis). We are grateful for our partnerships with these businesses! We also receive food from River Bend and Midwest Food Banks. Since we are able to purchase food at a low cost from River Bend Food Bank, your monetary donations can go farther than if you purchased food from a store to donate. We are grateful



for any and all types of donations! Guests at the Geneseo-Atkinson Food Pantry are able to choose the food they take home, so food is not wasted and guests get the food they need.

The Geneseo-Atkinson Food Pantry now has a van, a gift from the congregation at Grace United Methodist Church in Geneseo. Now that the Food Pantry picks up food from three stores outside of Geneseo, it was not feasible for the Pantry employees' vehicles to be utilized due to traveling distance and quantity of food. Donations often require multiple trips due to the size of personal vehicles. The donation of the van will enable the Food Pantry to pick up larger quantities of food in less trips, which will help meet the increased need. Thank you, Grace United Methodist Church!

Do you want to achieve significant life changes and receive help and support setting and reaching your goals? Then the **Five Loaves** program at Geneseo-Atkinson Food Pantry is for you! Call 309-944-3165 or visit geneseofoodpantry.org for more information.

Dietitians from Hammond-Henry Hospital taught a **free healthy cooking class** on February 20 in the Matthew 25 room at the Food Pantry. Guests were provided with recipes for lower cost healthy dishes, a cooking demonstration, and free samples of healthy food. The Dietitians will be back to teach a class on **March 11 at 1:00**, and it's open to the public.

The Food Pantry partners with local nurses to provide two **Foot Care Clinics** to the public each month. Nurses soak feet, trim and file toenails, help with ingrown toenails, and give a light foot massage with lotion. Please call 309-944-3165 or email geneseopantry1@gmail.com to make an appointment. Cost is \$37 but Food Pantry guests are given a voucher.

The Food Pantry accepts any size clothing, accessories, kitchenware, decorations, books, games, toys, movies, and other household items. If donors have large items they want to donate, we post the name of the item on the white board, and if someone is interested in the item, we give them the phone number of the donor to arrange pickup.



Our Volunteer of the Month, **Teresa Krause**, has been volunteering at the Food Pantry since August. She works in the clothing room greeting customers, sorting donations, and helping guests find clothing. Teresa is married to Steve, and they have six children and 17 grandchildren. She enjoys reading, gardening, cooking, and traveling. She is also active in various ministries at First Methodist Church. Teresa said the best thing about volunteering at the Food Pantry is helping people. When she retired, she wanted to give back to her community by helping people in need. Teresa said that one morning she helped a man who was starting from nothing find some housewares for his apartment. He was so grateful, and it warmed her heart. Thank you, Teresa!
