#### LOOKING FORWARD TO THE FUTURE

From Pastor

Dear Saints,

"...and I look for the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen."

The concluding lines of the Apostles' Creed bid us to look forward to the future. Faced with daily troubles we are eager for the days when we will no longer have such difficulties. But when will that be? Jesus tells us not to be worried about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself (Matthew 6:34). Are we longing for a future on earth that will never be? For as soon as we believe we have made an accomplishment or escaped trouble, another difficulty arises, another concern, another struggle, another stress. "In this world you will have tribulation", says Jesus, "but take heart, I have overcome the world" (John 16:33).

In Revelation, this sinful world—even life in this sinful world—is known as the great tribulation. "These [who are clothed in white robes and standing before the throne of God in heaven] are the ones coming out of the great tribulation. They have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb" (Revelation 7:14). Those who have gone before us with the sign of faith, they are looking forward to the same day we are—the day of the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. While these saints rest safely in the hands of God, having finished their course in faith, (we sing in For All The Saints) "we feebly struggle, [while] they in glory shine". This great tribulation is our struggle with sin and wickedness and evil in this life. And it takes a toll on us.

God does not leave us without hope. "[O]ur Lord Jesus Christ himself, and God our Father, ...loved us and gave us eternal comfort and good hope through grace" (2 Thessalonians 2:16). This is grace, that Jesus came to this great tribulation to suffer through it for us, in our place, so that all who abide in Him will not suffer eternally. He was troubled, and He endured faithfully. He had no place to lay His head, yet all His needs were provided. He looked forward to the cross (Hebrews 12:2), for thereby He would accomplish salvation for us. He has died, and behold, He is risen from the dead, never to die again! Death no longer has dominion over Him (Romans 6:9)!

And the One who is raised from the dead and is seated on the throne will keep those who die in Him safe until the day of the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come.

Look forward to this blessed end! Until then He comforts us and strengthens us to endure by the Holy Spirit. The Spirit acts and works through the Holy Christian Church and the Means of Grace. The communion of saints gather with one another and with Christ, as He comes to be present with us, to comfort, console, and encourage one another in this Christian faith and life. Together we are granted the forgiveness of sins for Christ's sake, and future promises will come to pass. Then because of the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection is ours, along with eternal life in Paradise. The Word of the Lord endures forever, and all who are in the Word will also endure to the end!

through faith in Christ alone an enduring reminder of God's mercy and steadfast love.




